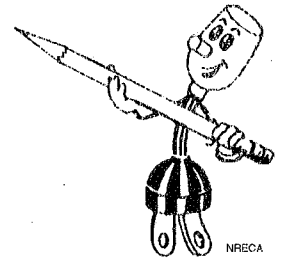

South Central Public Power District is one, of thirty-five, member systems of the Nebraska Rural Electric Association that sponsors area youth interested in attending the Youth Energy Leadership Camp held annually at the State 4H Camp near Halsey, NE.

This camp is available to youth who are currently in the 9th, 10th, or 11th grade and whose electric provider is **South Central Public Power District**. Students, whose family lives in the cities of Blue Hill, Nelson, Red Cloud, Superior, and Sutton, are not eligible as these cities have their own electric utilities.

The Rural Electric Youth Energy Leadership Camp involves about 65 highly motivated high school-aged men and women from Nebraska, Wyoming, South Dakota and Colorado whose rural homes are served by one of the Nebraska Rural Electric Association's member-systems. The camp offers educational and recreational experiences, leadership training, environmental awareness, character building and social interaction.

Through workshops and guest speakers, students learn about energy generation, electric safety and careers in the rural electric program. A highlight of the camp is the tour of the Gerald Gentleman Power Station near North Platte and the Kingsley Hydro-Electric Power Plant near Ogallala.

The week is intermingled with fun activities, including sports tournaments, canoeing, dancing, a get-acquainted party, and some free time to socialize and make new friends.

Those selected by their sponsoring rural electric system will receive an all-expense paid trip to the Youth Energy Leadership Camp at the State 4-H Camp near Halsey. Camp begins around 3:30 pm. (CDT) on Monday, July 20th and will end around noon on Friday, July 24th. Your sponsoring rural electric system will provide you with transportation to and from the camp.

Leadership is stressed when students compete to win a free trip to Washington D.C. as ambassadors and/or return to the next year's camp as a junior counselor. Campers sponsored by South Central PPD, who do not win the free trip while competing at the camp, can apply for sponsorship to the Washington DC Youth Tour in a contest offered by South Central PPD after the camp.

Thirty-five member systems of the Nebraska Rural Electric Association sponsor the 2020 Nebraska Rural Electric Youth Leadership Camp.

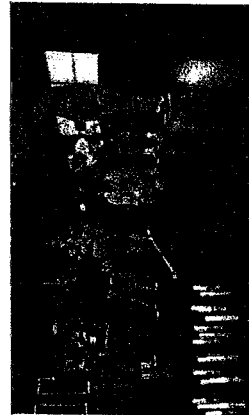
